

Strides and Travels: **2019 AHNB Pre-Conference Schedule** October 22, 2019

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In this full-day workshop hosted by Metepenagiag Heritage Park and facilitated by representatives of the Fredericton Region Museum, participants will participate in a Blanket Exercise unique to New Brunswick. They will also explore ways of decolonizing their own museum or historic site. Overall objectives include:

Establish sensitivity and awareness for Indigenous experiences in Residential Schools and Day Schools in Atlantic Canada:

Familiarise participants with the 94 Calls to Action and how they relate to Museums and Historic Sites;

Explore ways of decolonizing their institution; and

Draft a Reconciliation Policy and Action Plan that can be implemented upon return to their institution.

The intent is that each participant will walk away with a practical "Action Plan" for Reconciliation.

Morning Schedule:

Begin with a smudging ceremony outside;

Participate in a Blanket Exercise (in the museum);

"Unpack" the experience with a Talking Circle;

Break for Lunch (included) – with optional tours of the museum and park (wear comfortable clothing and walking shoes)

Afternoon Schedule:

Participate in a Project of Heart memorial tile activity;

Explore Dr. Marie Battiste's teachings around decolonization;

Brainstorm on ways to decolonise New Brunswick's museums and historic sites;

Draft a Policy statement and action plan;

Close with a smudging ceremony and Q&A session about next steps in Reconciliation.
