- Submit a photo or video of yourself at one of New Brunswick's covered bridges to be entered in the draw for the 50\$ prize.
- Submit a description or a video of your favourite covered bridge ritual (do you hold your breath while you cross? Sing at the top of your lungs?) to be entered in the draw for a framed print of a covered bridge!

- Only one entry per email address will be accepted. Entry must include your name, complete address, and telephone number.
- Prizes will be awarded in the order in which they are drawn.
- The names of winners, along with their place name (**city/province/country**) will be posted on AHNB's Facebook page.
- AHNB assumes the right to post any or all photos on its Facebook page, with credit given to the photographer. Entrants may refuse permission for the use of their photos by stating "PERMISSION DENIED" in the subject line of the email entry.

Love Your Covered Bridges Days is such an event. Please be advised there is no supervision at any of the 58 covered bridges. The AHNB has no control over the settings, at or near the covered bridges. It is up to the individual(s) who choose to participate in activities associated with Love Your Covered Bridges Days, that they do so in a way that will not jeopardize their own well-being, as well as that of others.

Be advised that, when visiting covered bridges, you must respect and obey the laws of the New Brunswick Motor Vehicle Act at all times. Here are some suggestions and cautions you should consider before starting out on a covered bridge adventure:

When visiting any of the 58 covered bridges of New Brunswick, please keep in mind some covered bridges are still in use. Please ***slow down and stay safe***.

Photos will be entered into a draw. Because we care about your safety, we do not want anyone to put themselves in harm's way trying to get the perfect shot. So remember, the quality of the picture is not what's important - ***having a fun, safe day is what counts!***

Be aware of your surroundings when taking a photo especially when parking and/or exiting your vehicle. For your protection, and that of others, do not stand at the mouth of a covered bridge or too close to the bank of the river or stream that runs below the bridge while taking selfies or group photos.
